My wife and I own a 101-acre certified tree farm between Sandy and Estacada, which we actively manage for a variety of uses, ranging from recreation to fish and wildlife habitat restoration to timber production. We are

My involvement with OTFS began in 2019 when our family became a certified tree farm. My professional background is not in forestry but in civil and structural engineering (now retired). Additionally, I am an OSU Extension Service Master Woodland Manager (MWM). One of our MWM tasks is to assist small forestland owners in our area by providing forest-related recommendations on requested aspects of their property. Additionally, in 2022, I was appointed by the Board of Forestry to participate in the Adaptive Management Program Committee representing small forestland owners. The task of this committee is to guide the



Adaptive Management Process as part of what evolved from the Private Forest Accord. In 2023, I was also appointed by the Board to their Committee for Family Forestlands, representing northwest Oregon, to assist them in addressing family forestland issues.

I look forward to engaging with you at upcoming OTFS, Oregon Small Woodlands Association or CCFFA events. These organizations share the common goal of helping small forestland owners.
